LYDIA ACKLEY CHAPPELL 1747 - ?
Widow of
NOAH CHAPPELL ? - 1826

LYDIA ACKLEY CHAPPELL widow of Revolutionary Soldier, NOAH CHAPPELL, was born in 1747, married to Noah Chappell on August 8, 1773. Lydia was receiving widow's war pension No. W-16530 in 1840 while living with Erastus Rogers in Leroy Township, Lake County, Ohio, at age 93. Rogers might have been a son-in-law but this could not be verified. Nathan Chappell and Roswell Rogers, brothers-in-law were living in Leroy Township, but it is not known if there was a family connection. No record of her death or burial.

Noah Chappell was a farmer by occupation. He died February 7, 1826 at Cherry Valley, New York. He enlisted April 17, 1776, at Hartford, Litchfield County, Connecticut, as a Private in the Continental Line, serving in regiment commanded by Colonel Elmore for one year. He applied for pension in 1818. Certificate of Pension S-552 was issued March 27, 1819 and sent to Morse and Stewart, agents, Cherry Valley, New York. On June 20, 1820, Noah Chappell signed an affidavit "In need of financial assistance" stating he had a wife and 2 grandchildren living with him and dependent on his support; 1 grandchild, Noah Demont, age 12, and Lydia Demont, age 8 years. Pension subscribed on the Roll of New York at the rate of \$8 per month to begin April 6, 1818. A daughter of Lydia and Noah married Adam Flint and resided in Canajoharie, Montgomery County, New York in 1837.

Further information on family or children was not found.

SUSANNA (SUSAN) NEWELL OWEN

SUSANNA (SUSAN) NEWELL OWEN was born in 1769, at Farmington, Connecticut, the daughter of Susanna R. Porter and David Newell. She removed with her parents to Tinmouth, Rutland County, Vermont, in 1785. She died March 4, 1848, at the residence of her daughter and son-in-law, Susan and Captain Ebenezer Hayes, in Fairport Harbor, Ohio. She was buried on the Hayes lot in Evergreen Cemetery, Painesville, Ohio. Susanna Newell married Joseph Owen in March, 1787, at Tinmouth, Vermont. He was born April 12, 1759, in Worcester County, Massachusetts, a descendant of Samuel Owen an Innkeeper from Wales. He died February 15, 1827, at Putney, Vermont.

Joseph Owen enlisted in the American Revolution while a resident of Brookfield, Worcester County, Massachusetts. He served
