

TWO FUNERALS.

Two of McLean County's Old Pioneers Laid to Rest Beneath the Sod.

—Two more of the honored pioneers of McLean county have been laid to rest, amid the regrets of all the people.

On Saturday the remains of Mr. Noah N. Jones, of Normal, were interred in the old cemetery at Hudson, in which already reposed several members of the Jones family. It is the resting place of many of the old settlers of Hudson and vicinity, and is a quiet, beautiful and peaceful spot. The funeral services were held at the family residence in Normal, where a very large multitude had assembled. The ceremonies were conducted by Rev. Cobb, pastor of the Christian of Normal. A large cortege followed the remains to the spot of interment. The pallbearers were Mr. Jesse W. Fell, Esquire Parks, Mr. Ellis Dillon, Mr. A. C. Cowles, Mr. S. W. Waddie and Mr. Lindsey.

The funeral of Dr. Jonas Fell, of Lexington, took place at noon yesterday at the home of the deceased in that city. There was a very large attendance—at least 1,000—filling the house and the yard. In the assemblage were persons from all points of
